# HEADLICE

The Department of Health recommends that parents use occlusive products, like the Hedrin 15 range, containing dimeticone and nerolidol. This treatment works by smothering head lice. It does not have the negative side effects associated with insecticidal treatments. It also kills lice eggs.

Head lice are a persistent problem in Territory schools. Parents should check their child's hair regularly to determine if treatment is needed. Before children return to school, it is highly recommended that re-treatment is made after seven days, ensuring newly hatched eggs are destroyed.
