Eisteddfod

Reporting to Parents

Student Led Conferences (Years 3-6) and Three Way Conferences (Transition to Year 2) will be held in Week 9.

This year, our Year 3-6 students will be participating in student-led conferences in place of the more traditional parent-teacher interviews or three way conferences. This change comes about based on research that shows when children self-report they experience greater success in learning. So, while the teacher will be in the room to clarify questions and spend time with each family, the student will lead the process of reporting their learning to their families. This, accompanied by a detailed end of semester report, will help you understand how your child is going at school. We will send home more detailed information about the process next week. If families have specific concerns or questions, they can always make a time to come to school and talk with teachers.

Outdoor Learning Day

Our school participated in Outdoor Learning Day last week with some classes spending the entire day learning outside. The weather is perfect for it, our grounds couldn't be more conducive and the children loved it! Learning doesn't just occur at a desk within four walls!

NAPLAN

The Minister for Education has confirmed that the Northern Territory's transition to NAPLAN Online will be postponed until 2019. This means that all schools in the NT will be fully implementing NAPLAN Online in May 2019 instead of May 2018. The decision to move the NAPLAN Online implementation to 2019, is a result of a number of considerations. The NT can benefit from the knowledge and experience of the states and territories testing in 2018 and will ensure the online testing platform has been thoroughly trialled. From now until implementation in 2019, the NT DoE will continue to engage with counterparts in other states and territories, as well as the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA), to support the work to progress the transition to NAPLAN Online.



They also went on a shape walk around the school to see the abundance of shapes that make up our wonderful school.



MAKUKUHAN Indonesian Gamelan

On Tuesday 6th June from 1.30-2.30 Musica Viva will be presenting MAKUKUHAN Indonesian Gamelan at Larapinta Primary School. Musica Viva has been bringing premium quality live music to Australian schools for over 35 years.

Makukuhan are a dynamic mini-Gamelan orchestra, whose performances are a riot of colour and rhythm, including pitch-bending drums, mesmerising masked dance and unbelievably rapid Javanese clapping. Gamelan features a series of bronze gongs and metallaphones that are integral to Indonesian culture. Students will be mesmerised by the pattern-based sequences that make the gamelan one of the world's most influential musical exports in the 20th century.



This performance is part of our school's learning program and builds on preparatory work done in the classroom utilising the **Makukuhan** resource kit. The kit's teaching resources are linked directly to the music curriculum as well as other curriculum areas especially literacy and numeracy. Parents are



invited to come to the performance. There is no charge for parents/guardians and community members to attend.
