
STEAM Family Night 31st August

Preschool News

National Aboriginal Children's Day

To celebrate National Aboriginal Children's Day the children engaged in a variety of activities and learning experiences focusing on Aboriginal culture including listening to traditional stories, learning about symbols and signs used in paintings, making dot paintings, singing simple songs with local Arrernte language words and learning about the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander flags . The children learnt what each of the colours on the flags meant and we were fortunate to have Kahlia (the school Aboriginal & Islander Education Worker) and some Year 5/6 students visit from the Primary school. These visitors introduced themselves and told us that their families were Aboriginal people who have lived in and around Alice Springs for a very long time. They taught us the local Arrernte word to say hello which is 'werte' and they helped to make a werte poster with our hand prints. We also saw the flags being used at the front of the primary school during one of our regualr visits.





Outcome 2.2 Connectedness - respond to diversity with respect by exploring diversity of culture, heritage, background and tradition.

St John's Ambulance Visit

We listened to a presentation by Regina from St John's about emergencies and the St John's Ambulance service. The children were excited when Regina told us about the work of the Ambulance service, showed us various equipment such as blood pressure cuff, oxygen mask and stethoscope and how each piece of equipment is used. We also met Able the Bear, read a book and discussed when to call an ambulance. The children were able to walk through the ambulance and see what was inside. They listened as Regina showed them the stretcher, gloves and oxygen tanks. We heard the loud siren and saw the flashing red, blue and white lights and noticed the emergency triple zero number on the side of the ambulance too. This visit provided the children with opportunities to meet community workers and to become familiar with their emergency procedures, vehicles and equipment.
