Principal's Report



Dear Parents/Carers and Families,

Reporting to Parents

Student Led Conferences (Years 3-6) and Three Way Conferences (Transition to Year 2) will be held in Week 9. Please be sure to send back the slip indicating your preferred day/times.

This year, our Year 3-6 students will be participating in student-led conferences in place of the more traditional parent-teacher interviews or three way conferences. This change comes about based on research that shows when children self-report they experience greater success in learning. So, while the teacher will be in the room to clarify questions and spend time with each family, the student will lead the process of reporting their learning to their families. This, accompanied by a detailed end of semester report, will help you understand how your child is going at school.

Interschool Athletics Carnival

The Interschool Athletics carnival is on Friday Week 9. Parents are welcome to attend and support for part or the whole day at the Head Street Oval if your child is participating in the carnival.

Larapinta Sports Day

The Larapinta School Sports Day is scheduled for the last day of this term, Friday 23rd June. Our Sports Day is held on Albrecht Oval. Junior Robo Cup

Ms Madin was accompanied by two students, Jamieka and Shaelah to a RoboCup workshop a couple of weeks ago. Ms Madin and her whole class will attend a RoboCup Challenge in Week 10. Junior RoboCup Australia is a project-orientated educational initiative that supports local, regional and international robotic events for young students. The RoboCup Junior Educational Competition encompasses not only engineering and IT skills, but extends right across a school curriculum. It also addresses social development by encouraging sportsmanship, sharing, teamwork, understanding of differences between individuals and nations, cooperation and organisational skills. It was lots of fun and we learned a lot about Aboriginal culture.

This has raised some concerns for teachers as most of the bad effects of video games are blamed on the violence they contain. Children who play more violent video games are more likely to have increased aggressive thoughts, feelings and behaviors. Popular MA rated games usually have the negative impacts such as:


- the first-hand role in killing process


