Principal's Report

Dear Parents/Carers and Families,

NAPLAN

We are in the throes of NAPLAN testing for students in Year 3 and 5 this week. NAPLAN is an annual national assessment for all students in Year 3, 5, 7 and 9. Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation), writing, reading and numeracy are all tested across a three day period. Results of the tests are returned to the school and parents later in the year.

NAPLAN is not a pass or fail type test, and is designed to illustrate the range of student performance across the country. Individual student performance is shown on a national achievement scale for each test. The performance of individual students can be compared to the average performance of all students in Australia.

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are already learning through the school curriculum. Teachers ensure that students are familiar with the test formats and provide appropriate support and guidance.

NAPLAN tests are constructed to give students an opportunity to demonstrate skills they have learned over time through the school curriculum.

A very big thank you goes to Mrs. Mullins for great preparation and support around NAPLAN and to all staff who have been involved from helping with breakfasts, to setting up classrooms and supervising tests. Once again a big group effort from our amazing staff team here at Larapinta!

WORLD WAR 2 STUDY TOUR

Five Year 6 students from Larapinta are in Darwin this week with groups from other Alice Springs schools for a WW2 study tour. The excursion is part of the **NT Government Anzac Centenary Program**. This excursion will allow the students to visit places of interest including the Defence of Darwin Experience, East

Point to learn about Darwin's role in World War II. The students chosen to attend demonstrate excellence in all areas of their learning at Larapinta, have high level attendance and epitomise safe, respectful, learners at Larapinta. What else is happening?

School Uniform

We have noticed a recent decline in adherence to school uniform policy. All students are required to wear **full school uniform every day**; that is, school shirt and school jumper (if a jumper is required) and navy blue shorts, skorts or tracksuit pants. **Skivvies under shirts are not part of the uniform and should not be worn.** This is in accordance with both Department of Education and School Uniform policies. Students must also wear a hat every day and have been requested to leave their hats at school so that they always have one in order to access the playground. Could parents **please ensure children are in uniform every day** and that they do have a hat at school. Uniform items are all available for sale at the front office.

Carpark

I would like to ask all parents to assist us to ensure that the afternoon pick-up runs smoothly for everyone.

- Parents, please walk your child/ children across the internal crossing in our carpark rather than walking out in front of vehicles during the busy afternoon pick up. Thank you to those who already do this – it takes just a moment of inconvenience but ensures our children are safe and have been provided with good role modelling.
- Parents, please talk to your child about looking out for your car and moving quickly and safely to the vehicle.
- Please move your car as far to the front as possible, as other vehicles are usually waiting behind and sometimes out on the road waiting to enter the carpark.
- Please **DO NOT leave your car unattended** in this area as this is a **drop off and pick up area only.**
- Please park elsewhere in the carpark if you need to leave your vehicle to assist your child/children with bikes, bags etc.
- If your child has not made their way to the car please leave the kiss and go area, drive around and re-enter the carpark and find a park elsewhere so that you can come and find your child.

Medications at school

If your child is required to be given medication at school, these need to be delivered to, and collected from the front office **by parents/carers.** For safety reasons children should not be carrying medications to and from school. Thank you for your assistance with this.
