What the children have been doing at preschool:

Science, Science and more Science!

We have been using a range of scientific skills such as observing, predicting and comparing while conducting more experiments using water and simple machines. Choosing different combinations of water, oil, food colouring and salt children mixed them to see what would happen. Even one of our Mum's had a turn. We also made signs to let people know

they were our experiments when we wanted to leave some in the sun.





We have been operating a conveyor belt, pulley and elevator and building with cogs. We have also been talking about where we see them in our community.

The Larapinta Child & Family Centre works in collaboration with families to strengthen the health and well-being of young children (0-5).


Speech & Language
